But the book does not depend for its interest upon its reality; it shows imaginative gifts of a high order, and proves Mr. Plomer a novelist of unusual promise.

The Socialist Utopia of fiction is usually peopled with paragons of virtue and wisdom. This book tries the experiment of peopling it with human beings, with curious and unexpected results.

The story of this novel is told in the first person by a young woman, who finds herself in the country in a family the members of which are remarkable in character. The characters are vivid and original, the atmosphere strange and haunting, while the story is powerful and exciting.

CASTLES IN THE AIR. By Viola Tree. Illustrated. MEDIUM 8VO. 18s.

Miss Viola Tree gives an account of her experiences in Milan when she was training to become an opera singer. The story of her hopes and fears is given with great charm and freshness, largely from her own diaries and letters written at the time. As her father's daughter she knew most of the distinguished people of the day, and thus gives an intimate picture of life in a brilliant circle, just before the war.
