BIOGRAPHY

FLUSH. By VIRGINIA WOOLF. *Illustrated.*
Probable price 6s.

This is a biography of Mrs. Browning's well-known spaniel, Flush.

FICTION

THE WELL OF DAYS. By IVAN BUNIN. Translated from the Russian by GLEB STRUVE and HAMISH MILES. 7s. 6d.

Ivan Bunin is recognised as one of the most distinguished of living Russian writers, and a new work by him is a literary event of considerable importance. This is the second translation to be undertaken by the Hogarth Press, the first being *The Gentleman from San Francisco*, published in 1922, and now out of print. *The Well of Days* is an autobiographical novel of Russian country life fifty years ago, seen through the eyes of a sensitive child with a passion for poetry. M. Aldanoff, an eminent Russian critic, himself a novelist, has said of this book: "I think that by reason of its strength and its beauty it occupies the very first place among the works of Bunin; and to say that is to say how important a place this novel will occupy in the literature, not only of Russia, but of the world."

LIVINGSTONES. By DERRICK LEON. 10s. 6d.

Livingstones is a first novel and is a remarkable achievement. It is on the grand scale, a novel of contemporary life centering in a fashionable decorating business, and shows how the private lives of the managing director, his family, his clients, and the various members of his staff are all equally interwoven in the faulty fabric of the present economic structure.

THE TWILIGHT AGE. By A. PROPHETT. 7s. 6d.

The Twilight Age is a first novel and tells the story of a man who tries to find a way of life. He is sitting at a table on a South Sea island and dreaming of the events which have led to his coming there. The island and the past are mingled as

he dreams and sometimes joins in the conversation at the table. Out of the dreams and the talk he discovers that for him the real spiritual world is the world within himself.

LITERATURE AND CRITICISM

PAUL VALÉRY. By THEODORA BOSANQUET. *Illustrated.* 5s.

Very little has been written in England about Paul Valéry, one of the most distinguished of modern French poets and writers. This book is partly biographical and partly a critical appreciation of his work and methods. It is a comprehensive introduction to a difficult artist who is little understood in this country, although in France his influence is considerable and his technique of the greatest importance to all who are interested in literature. The book contains a frontispiece photograph of M. Valéry.

NEW COUNTRY: POETRY AND PROSE. By the authors of *New Signatures*, edited by MICHAEL ROBERTS. Probable price 7s. 6d.

A year ago it was generally recognised that the work of certain of the contributors to *New Signatures* represented something more than the latest literary movement. In this book these young men have definitely outgrown the doubt and indecision of the post-war years and look forward to the new world which their generation must ultimately bring into being. The volume contains a long satirical poem by W. H. Auden, *A Letter to a Young Revolutionary* by C. Day Lewis, an *Exhortation* by Michael Roberts, and poems and stories by Richard Goodman, Christopher Isherwood, John Lehmann, Stephen Spender, A. S. J. Tessimond, Edward Upward and Rex Warner.
